2022 ANNUAL REPORT



Dear friends

World Hope International Australia has gone through a huge transition during 2022, with the departure of Ruth Thomas in January after many years of dedicated service. I took the helm from February and have enjoyed a roller coaster ride ever since. Both globally and at home we have experienced a lessening but still significant impact from Covid-19, and World Hope International staff have continued to deliver quality programs to those most in need.

In Cambodia we connected over 1,300 households to a clean water supply, supported 536 children to attend five partner schools, and provided 1,358 after-school program sessions. In the Philippines we trained 209 adults and 201 youths to raise awareness and prevent online sexual abuse and exploitation of children (OSAEC). Closer to home, in Queensland we provided over 3,000 lunches and breakfasts, and 14,000 pieces of fruit through our Food for Kids program. This year we have seen an unprecedented number of emergency appeals in response to natural disasters, including late 2021 Typhoon Rae in the Philippines, the earthquake in Tonga and the East Coast Floods in Australia in early 2022. This was closely followed by the ongoing appeal to raise funds to provide for the victims of the ongoing war in the Ukraine.

The world around us continues to change, and whilst this has always been true, the pace of change appears to be accelerating. World Hope International is continually looking for ways to improve and expand our impact, working with partners and local communities to implement sustainable and environmentally friendly solutions.

This report provides a brief insight into the valuable work we do. We couldn't do any of this without the support of our donors and partners, for which I thank you from the bottom of my heart. I pray for your continued generosity and look forward to partnering with you as we aim to grow our impact.
